### Message from the Junior School HOD

In a recent assembly, I shared with the boys my thoughts around an article that I read recently. The article concerned the annual salaries of the CEOs of South Africa's major banks (the information can be accessed from News24 or Businessstech).

The annual packages of the CEOs are as follows:

- Investec R175 million (which equates to R470 000 per day)
- Nedbank R92.5 million
- Standard Bank R83.3 million
- Capitec R65.7 million
- ABSA R40 million
- FNB R31.9 million

My thoughts are twofold, and they might seem conflicting, but stay with me.

My first thought is that in a country where inequality and poverty are a primary challenge, it is immoral for one individual to earn this amount of money in a year. It is simply unjustifiable. Talk all you want to about skills and competence, it makes no difference. You cannot claim to be a part of building a just South Africa if you allow yourself to be paid this amount of money, even if you are doing the most important job in the land. My second thought is why should one of these CEOs not be a Graemian? We are challenging Graemians this year, in a deliberate way, to DREAM BIG DREAMS. We are challenging our Leopards to understand that, just like any other young South African, they have the right to dream to occupy the most significant positions in South African society. They must never allow anyone to look down upon them, or tell them that they cannot do it. If they are willing to work, sweat and toil they can achieve the seemingly impossible.

However, when these Graemians occupy these positions we expect them to lead in the way that they were taught while at the College. We trust that they will lead - whether in the fields of commerce, education, law, politics, arts, faith or sport - with kindness, fairness and integrity. So when a Graemian is leading a major South African bank one day, he will ask for a salary of R2 million a year - and he will ask for the salaries of the lowest paid workers in the company to increase and be at a level that reduces inequality and poverty and increases justice and equality.

The evidence is undeniable and continues to grow—smartphone use among children has reached a critical moment. We are witnessing firsthand the devastating impact on young people's mental health. Mental health professionals widely acknowledge the direct link between excessive smartphone use and real-world harm. We urge parents, educators, and other schools to take a stand. Let's work together to protect our children's well-being. Join us in making this pledge and be part of the change!



### SMARTPHONES DAMAGE CHILDREN

We, the undersigned, strongly believe that children under the age of 16 should not have access to smartphones. This belief is guided by emerging research, as well as common sense developed through our extensive time working with young people in schools.

Smartphones, with access to social media and the internet, are damaging young lives. The process is largely unseen and silent. However, its effects are potent and eventually manifest through any one or all of the following:

increased levels of anxiety, heightened levels of stress, depression, sleep disturbances, impaired communication skills, an inability to sustain healthy relationships both at home and at school, behavioral problems which may include aggression and hyperactivity, leisure boredom and generally inappropriate age-related behaviour.

Furthermore, early research suggests that habitual use of smartphones may have a negative and lasting impact on the ability to think, remember, pay attention and regulate emotions. As teachers, we observe all of the above in our classrooms on a daily basis.

These are the after-effects of access to online bullying, inappropriate social pressure and harmful content. Smartphones are exposing our children to social contexts that they are simply not mature enough to process – and as children, never will be.

With regards to technology, the world has changed beyond recognition – but our response as parents and care-givers to how it impacts children has been slow, bordering on negligent. We are generally very good at protecting our children from obviously visible threats – no decent parent would allow their children access to tobacco products, alcohol or drugs. However, we allow our children full access to the internet and social media, which can rewire their brains and cause great harm, because society has told us that technology is positive and desirable.

In the 1950s doctors used to prescribe smoking to assist patients with their respiratory systems. This was before smoking was shown, beyond any doubt, to cause cancer and related diseases. As teachers, from working with children, we have seen the impact that cellphones are having on young people and we know that – eventually – research will show that smartphones damage young lives. At which point governments will be forced to introduce legislation to protect young people from smartphones. But we would like to start a movement that recognizes the problem now and protects children now. We cannot wait for scientific research to prove what we, as teachers, already know to be true.

We are calling for parents and guardians to:

- 1) not purchase a smartphone for their child until they are 14
- 2) not allow their children access to social media until they are 16

This can be hard to do if you feel that you are alone. Your child might also manipulate you and say that they are the only ones without a phone. However, if we all do it together then it will become much easier to do. We want to make it 'normal' for children not to have access to a cellphone.

Proponents of cellphone use will say that children must have phones for their own safety. If this is one of the reasons that you buy your child a smartphone, then rather buy them a device that only has the capability to make calls and send texts.

We are not alone in this concern for children's wellbeing. A movement called *Smartphone Free Childhood*, founded in the U.K. in February to support parents who are refraining from giving their children smartphones has grown exponentially and has now spread to the USA, Canada and was recently launched in Cape Town.

Please give this matter the time that it deserves. Your child's sound mental, emotional and social development is at stake.

As well as being adapted for swimming, their back legs have long toes whose sharp claws are used to cut up larger prey into bite-sized pieces.

Thank you to one of the youngest Graemians, Finn Pretorius for catching these creatures and donating them to the Life Science classroom.





We are delighted to announce that Graeme College has purchased a full membership of the VIVE TEEN WELLNESS application, which will enable ALL our learners to have full access to the app. It is something that we have thoroughly investigated, and feel that this is a massive step in the right direction for the wellbeing of our all learners. We are excited that every learner will have safe space to learn more about mental wellness, and reach out for help if needed, in a number of ways.

VIVE TEEN WELLNESS is an Artificial Intelligence enabled digital platform and smartphone application that was built in South Africa. The first version was launched earlier in 2023, with several schools presently using the full suite of functionality. The schools and learners that have been using the platform in recent months have provided us with very valuable feedback that assisted us in planning the next phase of the roll-out.

During 2022 VIVE TEENS has been selected as a winner in the UpLink - World Economic Forum (WEF) Youth Mental Health Challenge where it has competed with over 120 other mental health companies from across the globe.

The platform is expected to launch internationally early in 2024, and as part of that process we are awarding South African schools the opportunity to gain from a locally built application and support the mental wellness of our children.

The Graeme College subscription starts from 1 September 2023, but we would like our learners to download the application in the meantime, and familiarise themselves with it by referring to the various videos and guides.


