#### Message from the Deputy Headmaster

Everybody enjoys reading or watching Simon Sinek's advice about creating positive space in the workplace, leading to more productive outcomes and a happy staff through a positive culture. At the start of the year, the Graeme College staff went through his lessons learnt from the SEAL teams, with regards to 'trust'.

He starts off with discussing candidates that apply for SEAL teams, and then graphs two characteristics. On the vertical axis is 'Performance' and on the horizontal axis is 'Trust'. He defines them as:

PERFORMANCE - on & off the battle field. Skills. In a School context - that means marking, learner results, ATPs, admin, punctuality, motivating learners, mentor role, portfolios role, etc. In your workplace it can be easily adapted. Being an efficient teacher.

TRUST - type of person outside the battle field. School context - relationships, role model, ethos, values, empathy, motivation, collegiality, support, etc. Being an effective teacher.

After in-depth conversations, he learnt a valuable lesson from the leaders of those teams. In the most elite/ advanced group of people in the world - he learnt what their focus was actually:


"The person to the left and right, are far more important than you alone." And with that statement they continued to explain how so many business models get it horribly wrong. Well, so many organisations get it horribly wrong too. It depends on how they evaluate what is important to them. In the business world it is

easy to value performance too highly - most metrics revolve around performance evaluation. As a result - toxicity prevails. The organisation suffers. I won't digress now, but the recent conversation about various airlines in the USA is such a good example. In fact, Sinek alludes to them in other talks. Maybe I will refer to those at a different stage, but it all points to an unhealthy organisational culture.

Obviously everybody wants the high performer with high trust on the graph as an employee - but, the SEAL team leaders do NOT want a high performer with a low trust. In fact. They do the opposite - they would rather have a medium performer, who scores highly on trust. That's the point that Sinek focuses on - if the most elite group in the world focuses on trust, rather than performance, why would any other organisation do any different to that. As a staff, we then spoke about the importance of protecting relationships and always putting people first in our organisation.

The outcomes that we identified from that, for our learners were:

- Teaching about AI use Performance vs Trust.
- Educate about toxicity as a team member
- Better team members, better humans, better society.

> Trust is valued over Performance.

For the staff, it always highlights the importance of camaraderie, respect and our value system in the staff room. Our goal for learners and staff - are to to feel a sense of belonging to our school/ team, with a high level of trust, between everybody. That starts with how we treat each other. So we always want to develop that trust. If we do that, we create great Graemians that will play a positive and effective role within society.

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
### Junior School Top Academics Camp


#### Grade Rs
















#### Grade 1s

### Grade 4s


Grade 4MG's first book review and a musical twist!




# Grade 9s

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#### Grade 12



# Teen App


We are delighted to announce that Graeme College has purchased a full membership of the VIVE TEEN WELLNESS application, which will enable ALL our learners to have full access to the app. It is something that we have thoroughly investigated, and feel that this is a massive step in the right direction for the wellbeing of our all learners. We are excited that every learner will have safe space to learn more about mental wellness, and reach out for help if needed, in a number of ways.

VIVE TEEN WELLNESS is an Artificial Intelligence enabled digital platform and smartphone application that was built in South Africa. The first version was launched earlier in 2023, with several schools presently using the full suite of functionality. The schools and learners that have been using the platform in recent months have provided us with very valuable feedback that assisted us in planning the next phase of the roll-out. During 2022 VIVE TEENS has been selected as a winner in the UpLink - World Economic Forum (WEF) Youth Mental Health Challenge where it has competed with over 120 other mental health companies from across the globe.

The platform is expected to launch internationally early in 2024, and as part of that process we are awarding South African schools the opportunity to gain from a locally built application and support the mental wellness of our children.

The Graeme College subscription starts from 1 September 2023, but we would like our learners to download the application in the meantime, and familiarise themselves with it by referring to the various videos and guides.
