### Message from the Deputy Headmaster

The Annual Graeme College Academic Dinner was graced by an extraordinary speech from Professor Warren Potts, a man whose achievements across academia, sport, and community engagement make him the perfect role model for our learners. His address was not just inspiring—it was a masterclass in balance, dedication, and lifelong learning.

Professor Potts' career is nothing short of remarkable. With a PhD in Ichthyology (2004), his academic contributions have had global significance. His research journey includes:

- 132 journal publications, with 6 more in review
- Contributions to 4 books
- Supervision of 44 honours, 31 master's, and 21 PhD students

Beyond academia, he has made his mark in sport. He captained the EP men's hockey team for 6 years, part of the South African squad for 3 years, and competed for South Africa in fishing for 10 years.

Despite his packed schedule, Professor Potts has coached junior hockey at Graeme College, demonstrating his commitment to giving back. His involvement in outreach programs earned him the Vice Chancellor's Community Engagement Award in 2017.

He shared his insights on managing multiple passions while excelling in all of them, making him the ideal speaker for Graemians striving to succeed academically, athletically, and personally.

His speech left the audience inspired, proving that great people are not just those who achieve, but those who give back, inspire, and lead by example.

We extend our deepest gratitude to Professor Potts for his time, wisdom, and the incredible role model he represents for Graeme College learners. His legacy is one of excellence, dedication, and the perfect balance in life.

Professor Potts spoke about his life and highlighted the importance of being passionate about what one does. He spoke of his fascinating life and how sometimes one has to look for opportunities. He is clearly a dedicated scientist, but also a humanitarian, a fisherman, a father and a genuinely caring person.

He gave the following pointers to the top Graemians:

- Focus on your short term goals.
- Exercise...Keep fit!
- Follow your passion.
- Spend time outdoors.
- Avoid social media.
- Open doors for yourself.

He reminded the boys that they are at a top school and that they must make the most of every opportunity. What an honour to have him address our Graeme College family.

### Academic Dinner 2025

On Thursday, 20 February the annual Academic Dinner was held in the Graemian Centre. The Academic Dinner celebrates the top four achievers from the previous year.

The theme for this year's dinner was the world of books. The theme was chosen because of its link to the academic theme. The greatest thing that one can cultivate is a thirst for knowledge. It is very exciting to experience a group of young people who are keen to get to know their world and all of its component parts. With everyone having such easy access to artificial intelligence, many people have stopped trying to think for themselves. The personal touches like a heart-felt letter may soon disappear, because we fail to express ourselves. Our connections to other people are of paramount importance. By being uniquely human, we ought never to forget that our compassion and ability to understand or show empathy for other people make us, not only who we are, but also gives us goals for whom we might like to be in the future. As you grow your knowledge, you are also capable of growing your character.

The miniature books that adorned the tables were a reminder that our understanding of other people often comes through reading. The books were filled with blank paper, because our young Graemians have their whole lives to tell their stories. These young men need to be encouraged to tell an honest story, as they will be the hero of the tales. They need to surround themselves with people who compliment what they are trying to achieve. The key messages included:

- Always try your best.
- Show compassion and understanding.
- Always grow your knowledge.

## Toes in!






